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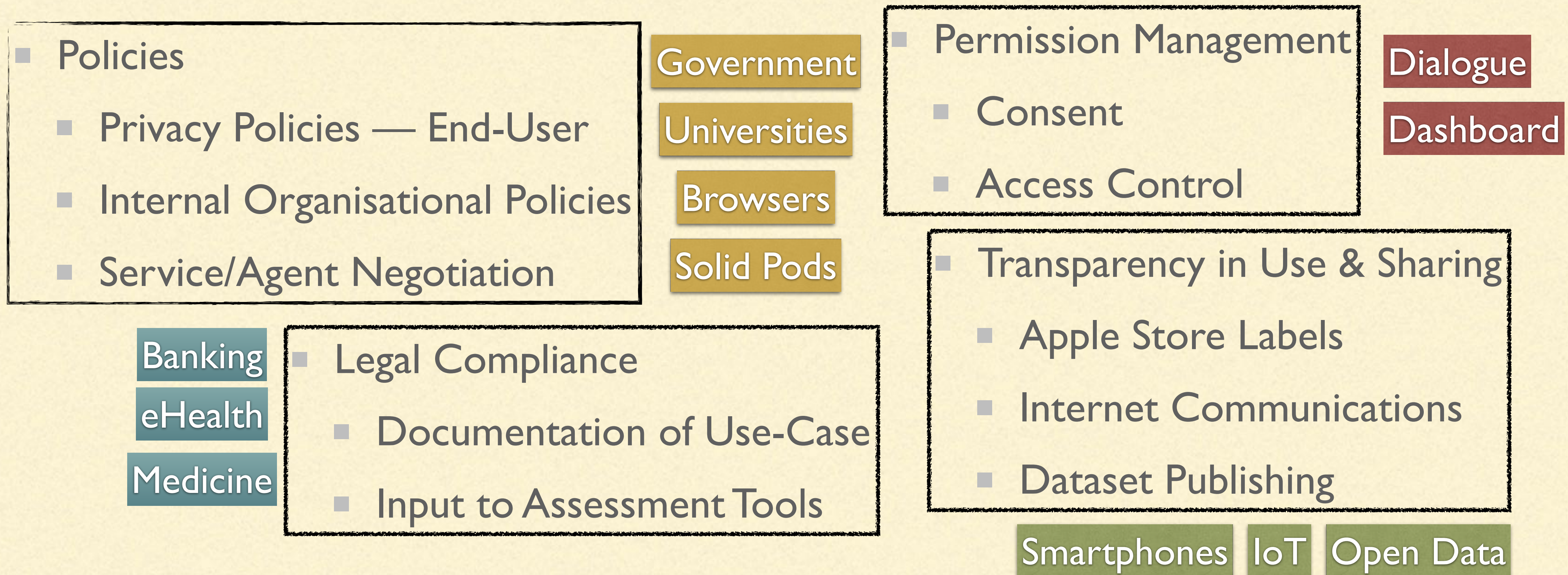
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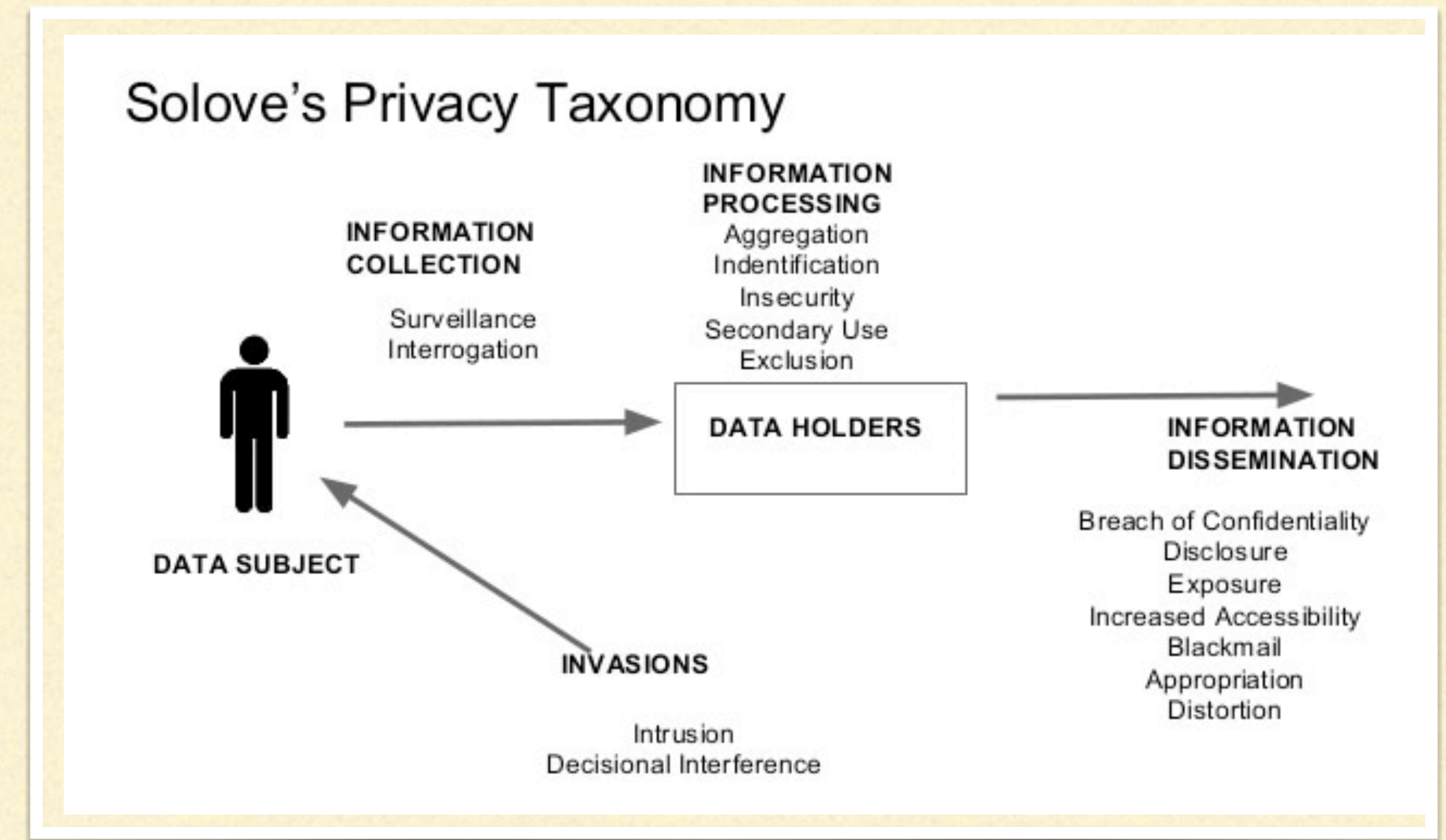

# Towards Eventual Standardisation

- Venues: ISA2 / SEMIC / CEN(ELEC) / ISO / W3C
- Too much variation in Global concepts for uniformity  
e.g. ‘Sell’ in USA vs EU
- Legality ≠ Privacy
- Flexibility vs Strictness in application
- Integration with standards e.g. DCAT
- Technologies e.g. cookies, databases, algorithms
- Benefits to all stakeholders: Controllers, Processors, Data Subjects, Authorities
- Not a “replacement” for existing practices: e.g. DPOs jobs can be enhanced by working on spreadsheets



The scope of DPV is in a progressive flux  
It needs a *diverse multi-disciplinary* cohort  
of experts to finalise concepts
